The AYJ Fund was created in honor of Anna Yan Ji Arabia, who was diagnosed at age 13 with gliomatosis cerebri (GC), a rare brain tumor. At the time of Anna's diagnosis, there was no research being done on this type of cancer. We are committed to supporting new research now being conducted to find effective treatments and a cure for this devastating disease.

The mission of the AYJ Fund is to bring smiles to kids with cancer, to keep them connected to friends and school through technology, and to support the research of gliomatosis cerebri and other brain cancers to find a cure.



AYJ FUND'S \$1 MILLION GIFT: A DREAM COME TRUE

Our dream for the AYJ Fund has always been to make a positive difference in the lives of children with cancer. Our hearts are happy each time we send a child a SMILE gift pack, knowing how much it can brighten a difficult day. At every International GC Conference, we are inspired by the brilliant physicians and providers who are so dedicated to this work. When we visit labs that we are supporting, we are confident that, in time, with enough research funding, there will be an effective treatment for these children.

Our dream is now becoming a reality. The AYJ Fund began 2023, our tenth year as an organization, by announcing we have received a \$1 million gift.

We asked Kate Belleau, our friend Jake's mom, to speak at our AYJ Fund Board celebration to share the

impact our board, as well as all of our AYJ supporters, have on the lives of cancer families.



It's hard to find adequate words of

gratitude while having this opportunity to thank the people who have brought us to where we are. Myself and my family have been so fortunate to forge the relationships we have with Kathy and Joe - but we have always been aware that the AYJ fund is propelled by many people who are filled with the same grace and love that they carry.

Our relationship with the AYJ Fund began in 2018 with a smile. The AYJ Fund, YOU, provided my son Jake with an opportunity for fun with his friends before he underwent a major surgery. \$1 MILLION GIFT TO THE AYJ FUND

On behalf of the hundreds of children the AYJ Fund has helped, and in memory of the angels whose lives have been taken too soon by GC and other cancers, we are beyond grateful to our donor, for this \$1 million gift, which will help us advance this vital research.

"We are inspired by the work of the AYJ Fund to support children with cancer and to drive research forward. We are making this donation to accelerate research for children and their families facing this devastating diagnosis," the donor said in making the gift.

100% of the \$1 million gift will be donated to Dana-Farber to advance GC research. Three quarters of the gift will be directed to GC research in their own labs and treatment for patients with GC. The remaining quarter of the gift, Joe Arabia said, will support an international collaborative research project, led by Dana-Farber and Boston Children's Hospital physician Mariella Filbin, MD, PhD, on gliomatosis cerebri.

"Generous gifts like this fund urgent research that can make a difference in treating pediatric brain tumors at Dana-Farber and around the world," said Filbin, Research Co-Director, Pediatric Neuro-Oncology



Program at Dana-Farber. Tab Cooney, MD, Director, Stop & Shop Family Pediatric Neuro-Oncology Outcomes Clinic, Dana-Farber, went on to say, "We are grateful for this donation to not only accelerate our understanding and treatment of this disease, but to also provide patient support before and after treatment."

"Without our multitude of

supporters and their contributions, of any amount, we would not have been able to do the good work that caught the attention of our donor," Kathy and Joe said. "This wonderful gift accelerates research to one day change the lives of these children."

And, with the donor's big boost to the research program, gifts of current and future donors will be able to magnify the support, through Smiles and Connections, of more children living with cancer.

IMPACT OF A \$1 MILLION GIFT TO THE AYJ FUND

We held Zoom meetings with Mariella Filbin, MD, PhD, and Tab Cooney, MD, to announce that we had received a \$1 million gift from an anonymous donor,

and discussed ideas on the types of research projects that this significant gift could have on advancing research on gliomatosis cerebri (GC). What follows is the Opportunity for Impact section of their research proposal.

Momentum from a \$1,000,000 gift from the AYJ Fund will see increased patient impact as follows:

> Utilization of next generation multi-omics techniques on precious patient samples to maximize information for personalized medicine;

- Expanded use of multi-omic matching tools to ensure patients enroll to the "right" trial for them, overcoming the limitations of current genetic-centric personalized medicine options;
- Utilization of a newly formed molecular tumor board that allows patients most likely to benefit to be able to join a trial of interest without delay;
- Expanded use of combination strategies;
- Novel biomarkers to teach us why specific new agents are working for some patients and not for other patients; and
- Interventions to improve physical, socioemotional, financial health as well as quality of life for patients and families.

Our goals have current and future patients at their core. The overarching research and clinical goals are to improve the lives of children with GC/HGG effective immediately, with long-term goals to improve survival. A coordinated effort such as the one described among Drs. Filbin, Cooney and their international collaborators will speed our progress and hopefully produce less toxic and more efficacious therapies for children with GC/HGG and ideally serve as a model for other types of pediatric cancer.

CELEBRATING 10 YEARS OF LOVE, HOPE & SMILES THIS VALENTINE'S DAY

On February 14, 2023, we will celebrate—yes celebrate—ten years since our Anna became an angel. We truly believe that since that day she has been

guiding the AYJ Fund to support other children with cancer and connect us with the brilliant and determined physicians and researchers who are moving the understanding of GC and other brain cancers forward. We feel her in our hearts, we continue to be inspired by her, and though we miss her every day, we know she surrounds us.

It is hard for us to believe that it

has been ten years of SMILES, CONNECTIONS and CURES programs. We thought we would share some of our initial programs and the history of our AYJ Fund.

Our first event was to hold a balloon launch for Anna's first anniversary. Friends sponsored balloons and attached notes. From there we held our first Wine and Chocolate event in 2014 and, that year, sent our first holiday backpacks. Since that time, we have supported thousands of SMILES, CONNECTIONS and CURES.
